COUNCIL 4034 HISTORY ON CD

In November of 2009, the History Committee, consisting of PGK Jack Grey, PGK Bill Novitsky and Jack Cavanagh, completed its work on a history of Council 4034 from its founding in May of 1955 through June of 2008. A summary was presented to the Council at the January 2010 business meeting. A copy of this history is now available on compact disk.

The electronic history was developed by extracting significant events from the minutes of the Council business meetings. These were collected into a portable document file (pdf) which is easily searchable. In addition, the committee compiled lists and scanned other Council documents that are of historic interest.
