## COUNCIL HISTORY The Catholic Encyclopedia

The display case in the Council Chambers contains a set of the first edition of the *Catholic Encyclopedia*. On the spine of each volume is the emblem of the Knights of Columbus. The *Catholic Encyclopedia* was published in 17 volumes starting in 1907 and finishing in 1917. The publication of the encyclopedia was sponsored by the Catholic Truth Committee of the Knights of Columbus. It is an excellent source of Catholic history, teachings, actions, and doctrine.

In 1993, Kevin Knight, then a 26-year-old resident of Denver, Colorado, decided during the visit of Pope John Paul II to that city for World Youth Day to launch a project to publish the 1913 edition of the encyclopedia on the Internet. Knight founded the website New Advent to house the undertaking, <http://www.newadvent.org/cathen/>. The first edition of the encyclopedia is also available from Google Books and other sources.

In 1967, the Catholic University of America published the *New Catholic Encyclopedia*. A second edition was published in 2003. A complete set of this encyclopedia has a list price of \$1981.

The Fredericksburg Council's copy of the *Catholic Encyclopedia* is a gift of SK Pierre J. Payette from the estate of his father Raymond Payette.

Christmas Brings Smiles

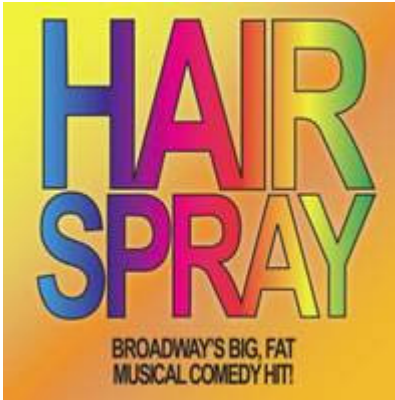
